

Does your organization need to register as a lobbying principal?

Wisconsin law requires your organization to register with the Wisconsin Government Accountability Board if your organization employs an individual:

- for compensation
- to communicate with state officials
- to attempt to influence state legislation or administrative rule-making on its behalf, and
- that individual communicates with state officials on 5 or more days during either the first or last six months of the year.

How to Register

Complete **Registration of Organization Employing a Lobbyist and Authorization of Lobbyists**.^{*} Enclose the organization's \$375 registration fee and a \$125 authorization fee for each individual whom your organization will employ as a lobbyist. If the individual does not already have a lobbying license, he or she should complete a **Lobbying License Application**. The lobby license fee in the 2011-2012 legislative session is \$400 to lobby on behalf of one organization, \$650 to lobby on behalf of multiple organizations. If you wish, your organization may write one check for the registration, authorization, and license, payable to "Wisconsin Government Accountability Board."

Registrations and authorizations become effective when the Government Accountability Board receives the completed form and correct fees, and expire December 31 of even-numbered years.

The Government Accountability Board recommends that you register your organization and authorize your lobbyists before they begin their lobbying activities.

^{*} If your organization's total expenses for lobbying during a calendar year will not exceed \$500, your organization should request **Registration of Organization Employing a Lobbyist Spending Not More Than \$500 Annually**. The registration fee for such organizations is \$20.
